- *Vocational and academic departments meet monthly to discuss curriculum and instruction issues.*
- *Grade 9 final exams are implemented in all four academic areas.*
- *Homework club is available for students needing support for completing homework assignments.*
- *DCAP (District Curriculum Accommodation Plans) plans are written for regular education students struggling with academic or technical course curriculum.*
- *SSVT continues to meet AYP requirements.*

Goal 7: Equipment & Technology: To utilize current industry-standard equipment for our vocational technical programs, and current instructional technology tools and resources for all programs.

- Advisory committees regularly request new equipment.*
- Budget FY11 reflects new purchases of equipment, but not all requests could be met.*
- Survey: Smartboards are a preferred instructional tool.*
- Vocational shop budgets are detailed and based on industry demands and advisory recommendations.*
- Nearly 100% of advisory requests have been met as of FY10*
- Technology purchases are checked by the Technology Coordinator*

- Recruit staff members to fill all posted extracurricular activities*
- Expanded student government*
